

CORAL COMMUNITY CHARTER SCHOOL MEDIA RELEASE FOR FREE MEALS FOR STANDARD Schools

National School Lunch/Breakfast Program School Year 2023-24

The Coral Community Charter School announced today its policy to serve nutritious meals every school day under the National School Lunch Program, School Breakfast Program, and/or Afterschool Snack Program. Effective July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024, children are eligible for free or reduced-price meals if the household income is less than or equal to the federal guidelines.

Starting on July 27, 2023, Coral Community Charter School will begin distributing letters to the households of the children in the district about the 2023-2024 eligibility benefits and actions households need to take to apply. Applications also are available at 4401 Silver Ave SE.

Criteria for Free and Reduced-Price Meal Benefits to Start School Year 2023-2024

The following criteria will be used to determine a child's eligibility for free or reduced-price meal benefits at the beginning of School Year 2023-2024:

Income

- Household income that is at or below the income eligibility levels

Categorical or Automatic Eligibility

- Household receiving Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP), Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF); or Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR)

Program Participant

- Child's status as a foster child, homeless, runaway, migrant, or displaced by a declared disaster
- Child's enrollment in Head Start or Even Start

Income Eligibility

For those households that qualify for free or reduced-price meals based on income, an adult in the household must complete the free and reduced-price meal application and return it to Nayamin Cisneros, CCCS Food Service Manager, at ncisneros@coralcharter.com.

Those individuals filling out the application will need to provide the following information:

- Names of all household members
- Amount, frequency, and source of current income for each household member
- Last 4 digits of the Social Security number of the adult household member who signs the application or, if the adult does not have a social security number, check the box for "No Social Security number"
- Signature of an adult household member attesting that the information provided is correct

Categorical or Program Eligibility

Coral Community Charter School is working with PED to identify all children who are categorically and program eligible.

Applications may be submitted anytime during the school year. The information households provide on the application will be used to determine eligibility. Applications may also be verified by the school officials at any time during the school year.

Determining Eligibility

Under the provisions of the free and reduced-price meal policy, Nayamin Cisneros will review applications and determine eligibility. Households or guardians dissatisfied with the Determining Official’s eligibility determination may wish to discuss the decision with the Determining Official on an informal basis. Households wishing to make a formal appeal for a hearing on the decision may make a request either orally or in writing to Nayamin Cisneros, CCCS Food Service Manager, at ncisneros@coralcharter.com.

Unexpected Circumstances

If a household member becomes unemployed or if the household size increases, the household should contact the school. Such changes may make the children of the household eligible for benefits if the household’s income falls at or below the current income eligibility guidelines below.
