

CORAL COMMUNITY CHARTER SCHOOL MEDIA RELEASE FOR FREE MEALS FOR STANDARD SCHOOLS

National School Lunch/Breakfast Program School Year 2026-2027

Coral Community Charter School offers nutritious meals every school day under the National School Lunch Program and School Breakfast Program. Effective July 1, 2026 through June 30, 2027, children are eligible for free or reduced-price meals if the household income is less than or equal to the federal guidelines.

Criteria for Free and Reduced-Price Meal Benefits to Start School Year 2026-2027

Under New Mexico's Healthy Universal School Meals program, all public and charter school students receive free breakfast and lunch regardless of household income. Families do not need to submit income information or fill out eligibility forms for their children to eat free every school day under current guidance.

Any household that wishes to order school meals should fill out the weekly order form sent in weekly communication posts to families via Bloomz or contact Hannah Force-Lang at hforcelang@coralcharter.com for additional questions.

La Escuela Charter Comunitaria Coral ofrece comidas nutritivas todos los días escolares bajo el Programa Nacional de Almuerzos Escolares y el Programa de Desayuno Escolar. A partir del 1 de julio de 2026 hasta el 30 de junio de 2027, los niños son elegibles para comidas gratuitas o a precio reducido si el ingreso del hogar es menor o igual a las pautas federales.

Criterios para los Beneficios de Comidas Gratuitas y a Precio Reducido para Iniciar el Año Escolar 2026-2027

Bajo el programa de Comidas Escolares Universales Saludables de Nuevo México, todos los estudiantes de escuelas públicas y charter reciben desayuno y almuerzo gratuitos, sin importar el ingreso del hogar. Las familias no necesitan enviar información de ingresos ni llenar formularios de elegibilidad para que sus hijos coman gratis todos los días escolares según las indicaciones actuales.

Cualquier hogar que desee pedir comidas escolares debe llenar el formulario semanal de pedidos que se envía en comunicaciones semanales a las familias vía Bloomz o contactar a Hannah Force-Lang en hforcelang@coralcharter.com para preguntas adicionales.

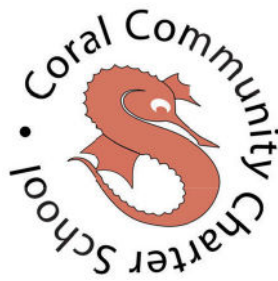
